WORKING CREDENTIALS

Credentials will be issued upon request to working members of the print and broadcast media. Internet-based media members will be provided credentials on a space-available basis. The UNCG Athletic Communications Office retains the right to deny or revoke credentials to media outlets or a specific member of the media.

All requests for credentials must be received no later than 36 hours before the game. Credential requests made on the day of the game can not be guaranteed and should be avoided.

For games on the UNCG campus, credentials can be picked up at the will call gate of UNCG's Fleming Gymnasium. Any outlet that is issued a season credential should still contact Liv Coiro in the Athletic Communications office to obtain courtside seating for all events.

Professional scouts should contact the Athletic Communications Office for press row space. Professional scouts will be required to buy a ticket and shall only receive space on press row if seats are available.

Spouses, dates and children will not be granted working credentials. Nonworking media will only be issued credentials on a space-available basis. Requests for media credentials should be sent to Liv Coiro, UNCG Athletic Communications Office, PO Box 26168, Greensboro, N.C., 27402 or by email to oacoiro@uncg.edu.

MEDIA PARKING

Parking is available in the Walker Avenue parking deck, located across the street from Fleming Gym. There is no charge for parking in the deck on game days during the time frame of an hour before and after each contest.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Accredited photographers may shoot from either baseline, but must contact Liv Coiro in the UNCG Media Relations Office for credentials. Photography from press row is not allowed without the expressed consent of a UNCG athletics communications staff member. Due to a limited number of phone lines on press row, telephone lines for use by photographers must be ordered in advanced and may require an installation fee to be paid by the outlet.

INTERVIEWS

Head coach Wendy Palmer will be available for postgame interviews in the UNCG Media Room following her commitment to radio interviews. Requested players will be available after a 10-minute "cooling off" period. Up to three players will be brought to the media room for games played at Fleming Gym. THE UNCG LOCKER ROOM IS CLOSED TO THE MEDIA.

Unless expressed permission is given by the Athletics Communications Office, players are not available prior to a contest. Requests for pregame interviews with coaching staff members should be communicated to a member of the athletics communications staff as early as possible.

Each day prior to the start of practice, selected players can be made available for interviews by calling the Athletics Communications Office before noon. All interviews must be completed 15 minutes before the start of practice. For interviews with Coach Palmer, contact the Athletics Communications Office. Practices are generally closed to the media, but may be opened at the discretion of the coaching staff. News camera taping of practice can be denied at the discretion of the coaching staff. For practice schedules, please contact Liv Coiro in the Athletics Communications office.

GAMEDAY SERVICES

The UNCG Athletics Communications Office will do everything possible to accommodate the needs of media covering Spartan athletics. Wireless Internet access is available on a guest server at Fleming Gym. Please see a athletics communications staff member for assistance. At Fleming Gym, a series of phone lines are available courtside for use by media members. For those wishing to make long distance calls, it is mandated by the UNCG Athletics Communications Office that those calls should be collect, with a calling card or via a

toll-free number. Exceptions may only be granted by the athletics communications staff and should be requested before gameday. In the case of exceptions, media outlets will be billed for toll calls made.

Print media (including photographers) wishing to have dedicated phone lines should contact the UNCG Athletics Communications office at least one week in advance of gameday. All installation charges will be billed to the media outlet. Please contact Liv Coiro in the Atheltics Communications Office for details.

Visiting broadcast media are provided one telephone line per Southern Conference policy. Nonconference schools wishing to use ISDN will be required to pay a usage fee. (Contact Liv Coiro in the Athletic Communications Office for details.) Requests for additional phone lines should be made well in advance of gameday. Additional phone lines will be provided if available. If not, the media outlet will be responsible for the installation and all applicable charges.

Internet media outlets provided with credentials will only be provided phone lines if available.

Athletics Communications staff members will provide in-game statistics to members of the media on press row via printed box scores and/or courtside stat monitors.

UNCG POLICY ON INJURY REPORTS

Due to circumstances surrounding the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), UNCG has developed a policy regarding the release of injury information.

UNCG student-athletes have the right to hold all injury information, except body part and playing status, confidential and private. As a standard operating procedure, coaches, media relations staff and other athletic department personnel should refrain from sharing specific injury information with the media. However, in certain occasions, injury information could be released at the discretion of the media relations department after authorization is obtained from the student-athlete.

It is the policy of the UNCG athletic training staff to not address the media unless it is absolutely necessary. Therefore, inquiries by the media regarding medical situations should be addressed to Liv Coiro in the Athletics Communications Office.

Dr. Franklin M. Gilliam Jr. - Chancellor

Franklin D. Gilliam, Jr. was elected as the eleventh Chancellor of The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, by the Board of Governors of the University of North Carolina, effective September 8, 2015. Chancellor-Elect Gilliam brings to UNCG and the UNC system a wealth of experience from a career that spans over thirty years in higher education.

Prior to this appointment, Dr. Gilliam served as Dean of the UCLA Luskin School of Public Affairs for seven years and was a longtime UCLA Professor of Public Policy and Political Science. His research focused on strategic communications, public policy, electoral politics, and racial and

ethnic politics.

As Dean of UCLA Luskin, Gilliam shepherded a \$50 million naming gift, and he led the school's charge to redefine its critical advantage and transform its scholarly and practical influence with innovation and impact. Dr. Gilliam launched UCLA Luskin's strategic plan in October 2011 with such new initiatives as Global Public Affairs, Digital Cities, Inequality and Democracy, Arts and Culture Policy, and Leadership, Dr. Gilliam focused on identifying society's most pressing problems and establishing the school as a leader in addressing these concerns.

Prior to his appointment as Dean at UCLA, Gilliam served as the inaugural Associate Vice Chancellor of Community Partnerships in the University of California system from 2002 to 2008. As Vice Chancellor, he championed UCLA's civic engagement by supporting engaged scholarship and community collaborations to improve the quality of life for residents of Los Angeles.

Dr. Gilliam is the author of Farther to Go: Readings and Cases in African-American Politics (Harcourt Brace) and his work has been published in many leading academic journals. He is frequently interviewed or cited by national and international news outlets such as CNN, The New York Times, The Washington Post, NPR, HuffingtonPost and the BBC.

Gilliam is a senior fellow with the FrameWorks Institute (winner of the 2015 MacArthur Award for Creative and Effective Institutions), where he has served as director for the "Framing Race in America" project and has contributed to research and training on health care, racial equity, early child development, youth and rural issues, and criminal justice. Gilliam chairs the Board of Trustees for the Blue Shield of California Foundation, and serves on the boards of South-

ern California Grantmakers, United Way of Greater Los Angeles, and FrameWorks Institute.

He was honored with the 2015 Upton Sinclair Award by the Liberty Hill Foundation for his renowned work advancing civic engagement and commitment to social justice. Twice nominated for UCLA's Luckman Distinguished Teaching Award, Gilliam has also taught at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Grinnell College and the University of Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania, and was a Visiting Scholar at Brandeis University.

In addition, he taught at Columbia University, Fisk University and Middle Tennessee State University with former Vice President Al Gore. Dr. Gilliam received his B.A. from Drake University, and his M.A. and Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Iowa.

Kim Record - Director of Athletics

Kim Record is in her seventh year as the Director of Athletics at UNCG in 2015-16. Record was named to the post Sept. 27, 2009 and leads a program that fields men's and women's teams in 17 sports, over 250 student-athletes and 70 employees. She was recently honored as one of 28 Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year award recipients at the 2014 NACDA Convention in Orlando in the NCAA Division I-AAA category.

Since arriving, Record has reshaped and revamped the athletic department across the board. UNCG has seen improvements on the field and has stimulated interest within the campus and Greensboro communities.

During her first five years at UNCG, Record has implemented 'The Spartan Way' strategic plan in an effort to ensure the continued success and future improvement of Spartan Athletics.

The plan includes five core values and six goals for the department summarized with

the motto - 'We discover and develop champions in life.'

Record has guided UNCG to success on and off the court during her time in Greensboro. In 2011-12 alone, the Spartans posted five regular season titles under her watch, including championship banners in men's and women's cross country, men's soccer, women's tennis and a divisional title in men's basketball. UNCG also had five Southern Conference Player of the Year award winners and five conference Coach of the Year honorees last season.

The Spartans have excelled in the classroom, having 92 student-athletes named to the SoCon Academic Honor Roll in 2011-12. Additionally, UNCG senior cross country student-athlete Ashley Schnell earned an NCAA winter sport postgraduate scholarship. Schnell and men's soccer student-athlete Peyton Ford picked up SoCon postgraduate scholarship honors. Women's basketball student-athlete Amy Clapper also earned the NCAA Women's Enhancement post-graduate scholarship.

Record guided UNCG through the NCAA Division I Certification process in 2011-12, which must be completed at least once every 10 years. The certified designated denotes that an institution operates its athletics program in compliance with operating principles adopted by the Division I membership.

Record, who served on the NCAA Championships cabinet in 2012-13, is also the vice-chair of the Greensboro Sports Commission, an active member with the Greensboro Rotary, a member of the Greensboro Sports Council and a member of the Women's Professional Forum.

Record, in conjunction with Chancellor Dr. Linda P. Brady, helped develop school spirit-building campaigns such as Move In, Sunday Funday, Go Blue Preview and Blue & Gold Fridays.

Record is responsible for the leadership, administration, organization and finances of UNCG's athletics program, which underwent a major shift in men's basketball. The Spartan men's basketball team began playing its games in the Greensboro Coliseum in 2009-10 and enjoyed success last season under SoCon Coach of the Year Wes Miller winning the North Division title. The Spartans will play in the Greensboro Coliseum for the fourth year in 2012-13, hosting 15 games in one of the premier facilities in the region.

Record coordinates fundraising and operation of the Spartan Club with the vice chancellor for university advancement. She oversees efforts to engage alumni, fans and the community with UNCG athletics. The Spartan Club surpassed its annual scholar-ship fund goal for the 2012 fiscal year and set a new all-time record for the scholarship fund. The Spartan Club increased its annual scholarship fund by 20.7% over last year's mark, increasing their efforts by over \$50,000 and surpassing the previous high that was set in 1987.





Record also has a lead role in strategic planning and in athletics facilities development. She helped complete the facility upgrades at the UNCG Baseball Stadium and the renovations of the HHP locker room facilities. The 12,000 square foot HHP facility hosts team lounges, shower facilities and general locker room areas for men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's cross country and track, men's and women's soccer, volleyball and softball.

Within the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), Record has served on both the executive committee and the Director's Cup Committee. Within the NCAA, she served on the Women's Soccer Committee and the Regional Soccer Committee.

A native of Charlottesville, she graduated from Virginia and earned an M.S. degree in sports management from Florida State. She has two sons – Kyle, 26 who lives in California and Josh, 21, a junior student-athlete at the College of Charleston.



Trina Patterson

Head Coach

First Season at UNCG ◆ Virginia '87 ◆ 0-0 Overall ◆ 0-0 SoCon

Trina Patterson was named the UNCG women's basketball head coach April 17, 2016. Patterson brings 17-years of head coaching experience at the NCAA Division I level to the Spartans and joins UNCG after spending the last three years as the top assistant at Old Dominion. Additionally, she has been part of USA Basketball as an assistant coach on two different occasions in her career.

Patterson, a native of Newport News, Va., joins the Spartans after spending the last three years on the staff at Old Dominion for coach Karen Barefoot. During her time at ODU, the Lady Monarchs posted three straight appearances in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT), including second round showings the past two years. She helped ODU record 56 wins over the past three seasons, including a 21-win campaign in 2014-15.

Patterson has helped Old Dominion bring in recruiting classes ranked in the top 50 in the nation the last two seasons. During her time she has helped the Lady Monarchs boast six All-Conference honorees, including Jennie Simms. Simms was named the 2015 C-USA Newcomer of the Year and is a two-time Conference USA All-Conference First Team selection. Patterson's leadership extended far beyond the basketball court as well, as six Lady Monarchs were named to the C-USA All-Academic Team and two received C-USA Academic Medals.

Old Dominion was a defensive force in Conference USA during Patterson's time in Norfolk. The Lady Monarchs finished the season ranked in the top five in six defensive categories, including topping the league in rebounding margin (+6.7) and ranking second in field-goal percentage defense (.397).

Prior to Old Dominion, Patterson spent two seasons working for Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame coach Tara VanDerveer at Stanford, working primarily with the Cardinal frontcourt and recruiting efforts. During that span Stanford racked up a 68-5 record, capturing the Pac-12 double (conference regular-season and tournament titles) each season and reached its fifth straight Final Four in 2012.

Patterson's work with Stanford's post players both seasons led to the Ogwumike sisters, Nnem-kadi and Chiney, being named to the WBCA Coaches' All-America Team in 2012, only the second time that Stanford had landed two players to the prestigious team, and Chiney earning her second straight nod in 2013. Both sisters were named to the Associated Press All-America First Team during this time as Nnemkadi earned the honor in 2012 and Chiney in 2013.

Prior to arriving at Stanford, Patterson served as head coach at University at Albany from 2002-10. She also served two prior head-coaching tenures -- University of Maryland Eastern Shore (1999-2000) and the College of William & Mary (1991-99). She was named conference coach of

the year on two different occasions during her 17-year career as leader of a program, earnings honors at both William & Mary and Albany.

During her 17-year head coaching career, Patterson guided 18 players to America East and Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) conference honors, among those a conference rookie of the year, and members of all-conference, all-rookie, all-defensive, all-acdemic and all-tournament teams.

At Patterson's first head coaching stop at the College of William & Mary in 1991, she took over a program that had not experienced a winning season at the Division I level. In her second year at the helm, Patterson guided the Tribe to the championship game of the 1993 CAA Tournament, and in her third season led the team to a 20-8 record and a third place finish in the conference standings. For her efforts, Patterson was named 1993-94 CAA Coach of the Year.


During her eight-year stay at Albany, Patterson was named America East Coach of the Year in 2007-08 after guiding the Great Danes to a school-record 10 wins in conference play. Albany would go on to reach the semifinals of the America East Tournament.

As a player, Patterson earned four varsity letters and was a member of four consecutive NCAA Tournament teams under head coach Debbie Ryan at Virginia from 1983-87. During her four years in Charlottesville, the Cavaliers went 95-23, winning 20-plus games each season and capturing three Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season titles. As a team captain during her senior season (1986-87), Patterson helped Virginia post a 26-5 record and reach the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Patterson has also spent time with USA Basketball in both coaching and administrative roles. Her first USA Basketball coaching stint was in 1998, as she served on Nell Fortner's staff for the R. William Jones Cup squad that went 5-0 and captured the gold medal. This team included future Olympians Tamika Catchings and Becky Harmon. She would next reunite with Ryan, serving on Ryan's staff as an assistant coach with the 2003 USA Basketball Pan-American Games Team that won the silver medal.

Patterson earned a bachelor's degree in rhetoric and communication studies from the University of Virginia in 1987. She completed a master's degree in human resource management from National University in 2002.

Patterson and her husband Carl are the parents of three sons, Carl Jr. (CJ), Matthew, and Joshua.

First Season at UNCG • North Alabama '09

Phil Collins was named assistant women's basketball coach July 1, 2016. Collins spent a year on Patterson's staff during the 2009-10 season at the University of Albany. His main responsibilities will be overall player development, working with the post players and recruiting with an emphasis on international student-athletes.

Collins began his coaching career in 2009 at the University of Albany as an assistant coach on Patterson's staff. Following the season he returned home to his native Australia where he spent the next year coaching at Knox Grammar in Sydney.

Following Knox, Collins became the head men's and women's coach at University of Technology Sydney for the 2011 season, From 2011-2014 he was the Head Player/Coach Development Manager for Basketball Northern Territory in Darwin, Australia. He made stops with Hills Hornets Championship League Women and Trinity Grammar School where

Assistant Coach

Third Season at UNCG ◆ Adelphi '10

Cait Wetmore joined the UNCG women's basketball program as an assistant coach in July of 2014 and was named the women's basketball recruiting coordinator prior to the start of the 2015-16 season.

During the 2015-16 season Wetmore worked primarily with the guards including Lucy Mason who was named SoCon Player of the Week three times, won back-to-back Player of the the Month awards and earned both Coaches and Media First Team All-Conference honors. While under the guidance of Wetmore, Mason became the program's all-time leading scorer with 1,907 career points and set the single-game scoring record with 42 points in a game. She maintained a top-10 ranking in the nation for points per game (22.2) during her final year with the Blue & Gold.

Wetmore also coordinated the team's offense that saw a jump in production from the season prior. The Spartans led the Southern Conference in scoring average (65.5 points per game) and offensive rebounds per game (15.5). UNCG shot an impressive 66.1 pecent from the field (41-for-62) to set a single-game Division I era (Since 1991) record against North Carolina Central (12/31).

Wetmore oversaw the development of sophomore Keli Foster who went from averaging 7.1 minutes per game as a freshman to 16.5 as a sophomore while earning a starting roll in conference play.

In her first year as recruiting coordinator, Wetmore recruited and signed two McDonald's All-American nominees in Alexus Willey and Mangela Ngandjui.

In her first season with the Spartans, Wetmore worked primarily with the guards including junior Lucy Mason who was named Second Team All-Southern Conference. Wetmore also spent time coordinating the defense which helped UNCG to lead the SoCon in steals, mostly due to the stifiling press defense. The Spartans finished the season second in turnover margin in the league as well.

year member of the women's basketball team, joined UNCG after serving her alma mater as an assistant coach for two seasons.

During the 2013-14 campaign, Wetmore helped guide Adelphi to the Northeast-10 Conference championship game and a regional semifinal appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Panthers were 23-8 overall and earned a No. 1 seed in the league championship tournament.

In her first year on the sidelines, Wetmore helped the Panthers to a 15-win season; the most since the '06-'07 year which resulted in the program's first NE-10 post season appearance and win since joining the conference in 2009. Her responsibilities include player development, strength and conditioning, scouting opponents, practice preparation, academic advising and recruiting.

Prior to joining the staff, she served a two-year stint as a graduate assistant coach for the Columbia University women's basketball team, Wetmore earned her Master's Degree in Clinical Social Work in 2012. As a member of the Lions staff, Wetmore assisted in player development, practice and game strategies, scouting and film breakdown.

At Adelphi, Wetmore served as a two-year captain and earned the team's Mary Ann Beaudry Memorial Award for her exemplary leadership in 2009. She played on a pair of WBCA Academic Top 25 squads and was twice selected to the East Coast Conference All-Academic team.

Wetmore is a member of the Women's Coaches Academy, Women's Basketball Coaches Association, Alliance of Women's Coaches, and National Strength and Conditioning Association.

Johnson will serve as the team's graduate assistant and will assist with film editing, community service projects and other assigned duties.





THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

The Southern Conference, which began its 94th season of intercollegiate competition in 2014-15, is a national leader in emphasizing the development of the student-athlete and in helping to build lifelong leaders and role models. The Southern Conference has been on the forefront of innovation and originality in developing creative solutions to address issues facing intercollegiate athletics. From establishing the first conference basketball tournament (1921), tackling the issue of freshmen eligibility (1922), developing women's championships (1984), to becoming the first conference to install the three-point goal in basketball (1980), the Southern Conference has been a pioneer. The Southern Conference is the nation's fifth-oldest NCAA Division I collegiate athletic association. Only the Big Ten (1896), the Missouri Valley (1907), the Pacific 12 (1915) and the Southwestern Athletic (1920) conferences are older in terms of origination. The Conference currently consists of 10 members in six states throughout the Southeast and sponsors 19 varsity sports and championships that produce participants for NCAA Division I Championships.

Membership History

On Feb. 25, 1921, representatives from 14 of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association's (SIAA) 30 members met at Atlanta's Piedmont Hotel to establish the Southern Intercollegiate Conference. On hand at the inaugural meeting were officials from Alabama, Alabama Polytechnic Institute (Auburn), Clemson, Georgia, Georgia School of Technology (Georgia Tech), Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi A&M (Mississippi State), North Carolina, North Carolina State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Polytechnic Institute (Virginia Tech) and Washington & Lee. Play began in the fall of 1921 and a year later, six more schools joined the fledgling league including Tulane (which had attended the inaugural meeting but had elected not to join), Florida, Louisiana (LSU), Mississippi, South Carolina and Vanderbilt. VMI joined in 1925 and Duke was added in 1929. By the 1930s, membership in the Southern Conference had reached 23 schools. C.P. "Sally" Miles of Virginia Tech, president of the Southern Conference, called the annual league meeting to order on Dec. 9, 1932 at the Farragut Hotel in Knoxville, Tenn. Georgia's Dr. Sanford announced that 13 institutions west and south of the Appalachian Mountains were reorganizing as the Southeastern Conference. Members of the new league included Alabama, Alabama Polytechnic Institute, Florida, Georgia, Georgia School of Technology, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Mississippi A&M, University of the South, Tennessee, Tulane and Vanderbilt. According to the minutes of the meeting, Dr. Sanford stated that the division was made along geographical lines. Florida's Dr. J.J. Tigert, acting as spokesman for the withdrawing group, regretted the move but believed it was necessary as the Southern Conference had grown too large. The resignations were accepted and the withdrawing schools formed the new league which began play in 1932. The Southern Conference continued with membership of 10 institutions including Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina, Virginia, VMI, Virginia Tech and Washington & Lee. The second major shift occurred some 20 years later. By 1952, the Southern Conference included 17 colleges and universities. Another split occurred when seven schools including Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest departed to form the Atlantic Coast Conference which began play in 1953. The revamped Southern Conference included members The Citadel, Davidson, Furman, George Washington, Richmond, VMI, Virginia Tech, Washington & Lee, West Virginia and William & Mary. Today, the league continues to thrive with a membership that includes 10 institutions and a footprint that spans six states: Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Alabama, Georgia and Virginia. Current league members are The Citadel, ETSU, Furman, Mercer, UNCG, Samford, Chattanooga, Western Carolina, Wofford and VMI.

Leadership

John lamarino was officially named commissioner of the conference on January 2, 2006. lamarino has promoted the Southern Conference through an ambitious agenda which has improved competition, upgraded compliance-related matters, launched the conference's Hall of Fame and increased the marketing and brand awareness of the conference and its member institutions. The Southern Conference named its first commissioner in December 1950. Duke head football coach Wallace Wade made the transition from Blue Devil football coach to athletics administration as the first person at the helm of the conference. Lloyd Jordan replaced Wade as the commissioner in 1960 and served a 14-year term until Ken Germann became the league head in 1974. Germann was the commissioner for 13 years and orchestrated the league's expansion to include women's athletics. In 1987, he was succeeded by Dave Hart who spearheaded the transfer of the league office from Charlotte, N.C., to Asheville, N.C. Wright Waters succeeded Hart upon his retirement in 1991. Under Waters' leadership, the Southern Conference expanded to 12 members, added three women's sports and posted record revenue from the basketball tournament. Waters, who is currently the commissioner of the Sun Belt Conference, was followed by Alfred B. White in 1998. White, a veteran member of the NCAA office, introduced the current conference logo and elevated the conference's commitment to marketing and development of corporate partners. Danny Morrison headed the conference from 2001-2005 and orchestrated the league's move from Asheville, N.C., to Spartanburg, S.C. Under Morrison's leadership, the conference increased its marketing and promotional efforts.





uring the 1997-98 season, UNCG, which was picked fourth in the Southern Conference preseason poll, wasted no time in proving to the rest of the league that the Spartans were a force to be reckoned with. In its first year as a member of the SoCon, UNCG carried an eight-game winning streak into the 1998 SoCon tournament. The Spartans then handily defeated Western Carolina, 86-54, before slipping past Davidson, 78-75 to reach the title game.

There, UNCG faced top-seeded Georgia Southern. The Eagles and Spartans had split two meetings that season. UNCG shot just 24 percent from the floor in the first-half and trailed at the break, 32-24. However, Rebecca Viverette poured in 18 second-half points and the Spartans shot 61 percent from the field to get past Georgia Southern, 75-69.

The victory ensured UNCG's first-ever appearance into the NCAA Division I tournament.

The 15th-seeded Spartans faced No. 2 seed Alabama in the first round of the NCAA tournament, falling to the Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa, Ala., 94-46.

Senior Biz Brediger posted the game's only double-double with 13 points and a game-high 14 rebounds, while sophomore Melinda Goodson was also in double figures with 10 points.

The Spartans were led on the season by a pair of All-SoCon first team selections in senior post players Brediger and Viverette. Both players became members of the 1,000-point club during the season, with Brediger scoring 15.7 ppg and Viverette adding 15.4 ppg.





SPARTAN

Student-athletes at UNCG have enjoyed a tremendous amount of success over the years. Although the athletic department celebrated its 48th season in 2013-14, athletics at UNCG date back to the 1940s in the days before the university became

co-ed.

Golfer Nancy Porter, who went on to a successful pro career, is regarded as one of UNCG's first student-athletes, competing in tournaments on the national level in the late 1940s.

In 1963, as the university prepared to go co-ed, UNCG began to formally organize athletic teams. Women's basketball, under head coach Ellen Griffin, women's tennis, women's golf and field hockey were started. LPGA Hall of Famer Carol Mann was on one of the early UNCG women's golf teams.

In 1967, UNCG began men's athletics and the intercollegiate athletics program received formal recognition from the university. In the fall of 1967, the Spartan was adopted as the program's mascot.

In 1968, UNCG's men's teams joined the Dixie Athletic Conference, known today as the USA South Conference, on the NCAA Division III level. Women's teams competed as part of the AIAW early on, with UNCG being one of the lead organizers of the organization. Two of the first men's sports were basketball and bowling.

In 1971, with the emergence of the five-player rule in women's basketball, UNCG finished fourth in the National Collegiate Tournament.

Two years later, the women's golf team won the AlAW national title – UNCG's first-ever team national crown. Porter coached the squad and future professional golfer Donna Horton White was on the squad.

Since then, UNCG has enjoyed a number of successes:

- Five national titles in men's soccer during the 1980s and a runner-up finish in women's tennis.
- An unprecedented five-year move from Division III to Division II to Division I -- went from Division III in 1987, to Division II in 1988-90 and have been Division I since 1991.
 - A trip to the "Big Dance" the NCAA men's basketball tournament in just its fifth year of Division I status.
- Men's soccer coach Michael Parker and women's basketball coach Lynne Agee were the first to lead teams to the NCAA tournament in all three divisions.
 - A baseball squad built from scratch by Mike Gaski that made it to the NCAA tournament in just its fifth season of play.
- A men's soccer program that conquered all comers for two months to become the No. 1 team in the nation in 2004, the beginning of UNCG's three straight NCAA tournament Round of 16 appearances and four in five years.
- Kyle Hines, who became just the sixth player in college basketball history to record 2,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 300 blocked shots in a career.
- Individuals like wrestler Dock Kelly, who overcame birth defects that left him without legs, qualifying for the NCAA Championship.
 - Students like Siggi Eyjolffson, who earned Academic All-American honors three times.
 - Men's basketball games moved off campus to the Greensboro Coliseum, one of the premier facilities in the country.

From major league pitcher Brian Moehler to MLS champion Alejandro Moreno to LPGA star Becky Morgan, Spartan alumni have gone on to successful careers in sports. That success isn't just limited to the playing field, either. The late Doug Hamilton was one of the pioneers within MLS and played on the UNCG national championship teams of the 1980s. Eyjolffson returned to his native Iceland and is one of the top people in his native country's soccer federation, currently serving as their women's national team head coach.

Spartan athletics has had its success stories over the years ... and the best is yet to come.

1973 Women's Golf Team

(Inducted 2004) Won the first national championship of any kind for UNGs, competing in the AAW National Truthsment in Massachusetts ... defeated Rollins College on the final hole for the championship.



1982 Men's Soccer Team

(Inducted 2004) Won the NCAA Division III National Championship without a home field . . . facilities at UNCS were under fenovation at the time, forcing the team to play its games at neaf-by Grimsley High School . . . the team finished 19-3-0, including a 3-0 win over Wake Forest during the regular season and a 2-1 win over Plymouth State in double overtime in the NCAA quarterfinals.



1981-82 Women's Basketball Team

(Inducted 2007) National Tunnersup in the first-ever MCAA Division III Women's Baskerball Toutnament ... amassed a fecolid of 25-3, losing in overtime at Elizabethtown College (Pa.) ... began a fun of seven consecutive 20-win seasons for the women's baskerball program.



1983 Women's Tennis Team

(Inducted 2006) With four fleshmen and two suphomores, team compiled a 20-4 fector, including 14-2 in the spring, and finished the NCAA Division III national funnets-up ... Amy Blown and Lisa Zimmetman eatned All-American booofs that season.



1983 Men's Soccer Team

(Inducted 2009) Brought home the school's second consecutive national fittle with a dominant season. Went 23-1-1 on the yeat, including outscoting its seven conference files by a combined 44-1. Twelve of its first 13 matches were wan by shutout. Won a then-NCAA record 23 matches, including fallying from a 2-0 deficit in the national title match to defeat Claimment.



1994 Baseball Team

(Inducted 2010) The 1994 Spattan baseball squadbecame the fifst team in school history to record a victory in an NCAA tournament at the Division I level ... In just its fourth year of existence, UNCG went 39-18 on the way to a Big South Conference title and 2-2 at the NCAA South Regional, defrating Southeast Louisiana and Tulane while falling twice to national power Southern California.



1995-96 Men's Basketball Team

(Inducted 2012) The 1995-96 men's basketball team was the fifst men's basketball team to feach the NCAA Division I Tournament after posting a 20-10 overall record and an 11-3 mark in Big South Confetence play ... The Spartans, under the direction of head coach Randy Peele, who the Big South Tournament title in just their second appearance all-time, posting victories over Coastal Catolina (78-67), Charleston Southern (69-60) and Liberty (69-53) ... UNCS advanced to the NCAA Tournament at the Southeast Region in Oflando, Ra, Mingto No. 7 Gnoinnati, 66-61.



1987-88 Wemen's Basketball Team

(Inducted 2013) The 1987-68 women's basketball team becomes the eighth team inducted into the UNCS Hall of Fame... The squad posted a 26-7 overall fecold and a 13-1 mark in confetence play before advancing all the way to the NCAA Division III National Semifinals ... The Spattans' 26 wins are second most in plogfam history, while their 13 confetence wins are the most in plogfam history... The Spattans owned one of the most prolific scaring teams in plogfam history in 1967-88 as they broke the 100-point bartier seven










Mike Berlicelli - Men's Soccer Goach

(Inducted 2000) UNCS supporter for more than two decades ... UNCG named its bashetball gymnasium the Michael Fleming Gymnasium in Dec. 1, 1994.

Belmar Gunderson - Amateur Athlete



(Inducted 2000) Patticipated from 1952-56 at Women's College ... competed in four Wimbledons and 11 United States Lawn Tennis National Championships (now U.S. Open).

Lewis Johnstone - Men's Soccer



(Inducted 2000) Led UNCG to three straight national playoff appearances ... third all-time leading scales in team history with 66 goals and 24 assists.

Ethel Martus Lawther - Administrator



(Inducted 2003) Served 26 years as head of Department of Physical Education (1948-71) ... developed both men's and women's intekollegiate athletic programs after Women's College became UNCG in 1963.

Jill Masterman - Field Nockey



(Inducted 2000) In the days of AIAW, a four-year standout on field hockey team and was a co-captain as a senior in 1977.

Ghancellor Emeritus, William E. Moran -Administrator



(Inducted 2000) Served as Chancellof from 1979-94 ... guided UNOG from Division III to Division I in 1991 ... cleated the Spattan Oub.

Angie Polk-Jones - Women's Baskethall



(Inducted 2000) Led UNCG to a 93-22 mark in her four years (1985-89) ... Division III All-American as a juniof ... UNOG's all-time leading scale) with 1,585 points.

Eddie Radwanski - Men's Soccer



(Inducted 2000) Led UNCG to back-toback Division III national championships in 1982 and 1983 ... two-time Division III All-American (1983 and 1984) ... No. 1 diaft pick in the 1985 Major Indoor Socret League d'aft by the Dallas Sidekicks.

Bruce Shaw - Men's Baskethall



(Inducted 2000) Led UNCG's first-ever men's basketball teams ... scored 1,401 points, becoming UNCGs first 1,000-point scofef ... two-time All-Dixie Conference honofee.

Rita Wiggs - Women's Baskethall



(Inducted 2000) Led UNC6 to state NCAWW title and AWW regional appearance in 1972. ... led UNCG in scotling for foot straight seasons and finished with 1,347 cafeet prints.

Jim Allen - Administrator



(Inducted 2003) Former vice chancellof full student affaits ... had oversight on proglam's move from Division III to L

Märe Burire - Supporter



(Inducted 2001) Led UNCGs charge in scholafship fundfaising ... deated fifst athletic endowment in 1987 ... (aised funds toward a total endowment now valuedat mote than \$4 million.

Renee Goltrane - Women's Baskethall



(Inducted 2001) All-American as a juniof (1962-84) ... first women's basketball player to exceed 1,000 paints and 1,000 febounds in a cateet.

Jason Haupt - Men's Soccer



(Inducted 2001) Two-time fifst-team All-American ... led UNC6 to a Division III national championship in 1967 ... UNC6's all-time leadef in goals scored with 77.

Pat Hielscher - Volleyhall Goach



(Inducted 2001) Coached UNGS's first volleyball team in 1970 ... guided Spattans to a 106-90 record and a MCAMW state title in 1974.

Wendy Engelmann-Gettings - Women's Baskethall



(Inducted 2002) Scoted 1,378 points and dished out a school-fecold 574 assists . . . was a third-team All-American in 1983-14.

Garol Mann - Women's Golf



(Inducted 2002) LPGA Hall of Fame member ... satned 38 LPGA victories in 22 years on tour.

Tom Martin - Men's Baskethall, Supporter



(Inducted 2002) UNCG's first male president of Alumni Board of Dilectors ... served as tti-captain of the first two UNCG men's basherball teams.

Andrew Mehalko - Men's Soccer



(Inducted 2002) Led UNGS to three (1983, 1985 and 1986) MCAA Division III national championships in his fool seasons with the Soultans.

Laura Mussulman - Women's Soccer



(Inducted 2002) Member of first women's socret team ... UNCG's first great goal-keeper in women's sacret with 18 cafeer shutouts.

Maxine Allen - Amateur Athlete



(Inducted 2001) Gaineled national attention as duckpin browlet... set world feorids and earned a top national fanking.

Elizabeth House - Media / Supporter



(Inducted 2003) Former sports writer full The Catalinian and The News & Becord covering UNOS athletics.

ENie Jones - Women's Tennis, Field Hockey, Women's Baskethall



(Inducted 2003) One of UNIOS most versatile student-artiletes ever as she excelled in termis, basketball and field hockey from 1969-73.

Mike Sweeney - Men's Soccer



(Inducted 2003) Amassed 55 goals and 27 assists in his three seasons at UNGS (1980-83) ... member of 1982 and 1983 NCAA III national championship teams ... led the team in scoring in 1981 and 1982 and was a first-team AII- American in 1983.

Donna Friesen Wigton - Volleyhall



(Inducted 2003) Volleyball standout at UNCG (1970-73) ... active contributor to the sport through coaching ... part of officiating crew at 1996 Olympics and 1993 World University Games.

Lynne Agee - Women's Baskethall Goach



(Inducted 2004) The first active head couch to be east/fined ... first couch in NCAA history to lead her team to the NCAA Tournament in all three divisions ... more than 500 career wins to her dielit.

Dr. David B. Knight - Administrator



(Inducted 2004) Not only a leader in the transition from Division III to Division I, but a leader on the national scene as UNCG's Faculty Athletics Representative ... became the only FAR to serve on the Div. I, II and III levels ... served as chair of the NCAA's first Division I Academics / Bigblity / Compliance Cabinet and served as a consultant to the NCAA on numerous academic reform issues.

Winn Hazlegrove - Softhall



(Inducted 2005) Three-time CoSIOA Academic All-American honoree ... one of UNCG's greatest softball players, still ranked in the Top 10 in 20 statistical categories at the time of her induction (10 years after her graduation).

Brian Moehler - Basehall



(Inducted 2005) UNGGs first player to be drafted in Major League Basebalfs First-Year Player Draft ... eatned UNGGs firstever win over a Division I opponent and went onto pitch for Dettoit and Florida in themajor leagues.

Michael Parker - Men's Soccer Goach



(Inducted 2005) Second active coach to be inducted (first male) ... winner of more than 400 collegiate matches, including more than 300 at UNCG ... Led Spartans to NCAA Division III national championships in 1965, 1966 and 1967.

Mancy Porter, Women's Golf Goach



(Inducted 2005) One of the pinneets of women's athletics at UNIOS ... coached the UNIOS women's gulf team to the 1973 national championship ... also considered one of UNIOS's first student-athletes, participating in women's gulfin the 1940s.

Liz Gremillion - Wolleyball



(Inducted 2006) One of the best setters to ever play for the Spattans, recording over 4,000 assists in her career ... named 1995 Big South Conference Player of the Yeat

Scott Hartzeli - Men's Baskethali



(Inducted 2006) Led UNGS to its first Division I NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament bid, in which UNGS nearly upset Gracinnati ... graduated as UNGS all-time leading scorer and set every UNGS 3-point shooting standard in his caleer ... led the team in scoring in three officis four seasons.

Dock Kelly - Wrestling



(Inducted 2006) One of UNGS first-ever quaffiets for the NCMA Championships (1996) ... compiled a 50-34 matk despite competing with birth defects that left him without part of an atm and a leg. Honofel by the National Witesting Hall of Fame with its Medal of Courage.

Jo Ann Messick - Women's Basketball, Women's Tennis, Field Hockey



(Inducted 2006) Three-sport competitor at UNCG in the 1970's ... four-year standout in field hockey, earning Deep South AH-Star accolades three times ... six-time participant in National Field Hudsey Festivals, including three while at UNCG.

Jim Swiggett - Goach, Administrator



(Inducted 2006) Pioneer in men's athletics at UNC6 ... served as men's basketball coach from 1968-75 and statted men's gulf program, serving as coach from 1967-79 ... also served as the university's second Men's Intercollegiste Division Cooldinator.

Ali Lord - Women's Soccer



(Inducted 2007) UNCGs fecutif holder for single-season and cafeer goals ... tallied 20 of more goals in three seasons ... had a single-season record 26 goals in 1996, earning All-American honers ... Big South Player of the Year in 1996 and SoCon Player of the Year in 1998.

Tonka Maynor - Basehali



(Inducted 2007) Ten years after graduation, still ranked on the top 10 list at UNCG in every offensive statistical category ... hit 362 in his four seasons at UNCG, logging 239 hits ... holds UNCG recent for cateer BBI with 171.

Becky Morgan - Women's Golf



(Inducted 2007) One of the most notable athletic alumni as a member of the LPGA Tour ... won the Big South individual championship filee times and eathed Big South Player of the Year (1995, 1996, 1997) ... a three-time All-American was medalist honors 10 times ... qualified for the MCAA Regional all four years, earning a spot in the national event three times ... an Academic All-American in 1997.

Helson Boht - Administrator



(Inducted February 2008) UNGG's Director of Arhietics for more than 25 years . . . Led the program through its transition from Division III to Division II to Division I and from the Big South Conference into the Southern Conference.

Larry Hargett - Men's Baskethall Goach



(Inducted 2007) Couched UNCG to its first NCAA Men's Basketball TouTnament betth, coming at the Division III level ... finished the 1979-90 season 16-12 to eath its first NCAA bid.

Br. June Galloway - Administrator



(Inducted February 2008) Served as the Coordinator of Women's Athletics until her passing in 1974, helping to develop the first formal athletics program at UNGS.

Dr. Frank Pleasants - Administrator



(Inducted 2007) Served as the Coordinator of Mea's Athletics, helping to develop the first formal athletics program at UNCS beginning in 1967

Gathy Roberts - Administrator



(Inducted Febtuary 2006) Has spent withally entire cared - beginning as a student - working in athletics at UNC Greensburg, overseeing athletic facilities and operations and serving as the Senior Women's Administrator.

Siggi Eyjolffson - Men's Soccer



(Inducted September 2008) Thire-time All-American and two-time Academic All-American ... UNCGs all-time leading scoter with 185 points, recording 75 goals and 35 assists in his four seasons.

Joe Stanton - Wrestling



(Inducted 2008) Compiled a 98-25 mark in his four seasons at UNGS, qualifying for three NCAA championships to make him the first male to qualify for an NCAA championship as an individual . . . was UNGS's winningest wrestler for 11 years.

Karyn Thompson Voelz - Softhall



(Inducted 2008) Must plotific hitter in UNCG softball history. Inducted 12 years after graduation and still ranked in top six in 12 offensive categories ... led UNCG to 149-86-2 mark and three NCAA play-in series during her time at UNCG.

Joseph Galdeira - Men's Golf



(Inducted 2009) A second-team All-American selection in 1979 ... was the first male student-athlete to earn All-American honors in any sport ... finished 10th in the 1979 NCAA Division III Championship.

Ghristine Hornak - Softball



(Inducted 2009) Won 52 games over two seasons pitching for UNCG. Led the Spattans to their first-ever NCAA Toutnament bid in 1997 while eatning Big South Pitcher of the Year honors.

Missi Olson Kovachev - Volleyhall



Onducted 2009) Led UNCG to 108 wins in her four seasons as a Spattan, despite the program being in transition during its dimb to Division I ... helped the Spattans to 32 wins and an NCAA Division II Tournament appearance in 1990 ... compiled \ 600 cafeer hills.

Ty Buckner - Administrator



(Inducted 2010) Helped build the foundation of the Athletics Hall of Fame and served as the school's first-ever full-time sports infulmation director when the university was transitioning from Division II to Division I.

Raila Maisonlahti - Women's Soccer



(Inducted 2010) During her four seasons (1994-97), the Spattans compiled a 59-23-4 mark, including a perfect 22-0-0 recordin Big South and Southern Conference play ... the 1997 squad set school marks for wins (19), shutouts (13), overall points, goals and assists.

Alex Lehnhoff - Men's Tennis



(Inducted 2010) The 1999 Southern Conference Men's Tennis Player of the Year ... as a jurior, he won the Southern Conference's No. 1 flight singles title ... won a school-record 27 matches in 1996-97, a mark that stood for 13 years ... went 94-37 in singles play during his career and also won more than 60 doubles matches.

Eric Guthrell - Men's Baskethall



(Inducted 2011) Two-time Fifst-Team All-Big South selection and a key member of UNCG's fifst Division I NCAA Toutnament squad ... Scored 983 points, gfabbed 859 Febounds and blocked a then-UNCG career record 183 shots ... Led the Spartans to a Big South Conference Toutnament championship and subsequent NCAA Toutnament berth in 1996.

Tere Dail - Volleyball Goach



(Inducted 2011) Served as UNCG's women's volleyball head coach from 1979-1999, amassing a career fecoril of 490-259 (.654), leading the Spartans to four NCAA Tournaments and 14 seasons of 20 of more victories ...Dail's victory total represents a UNCG record, 384 more than second place. Her 1984 & 1989 teams set the school record for wins in a season with 34.

Melinda Goodson - Women's Baskethall



(Inducted 2011) One of just two women's basketball playets to have her number retired. Goodson (1997-2000) finished her career as the school's No. 2 all-time leading scorer with 1,464 points — tops in UNGG's Division Lefa ... Led the Spartans to their first NCAA Division I tournament appearance in 1998 as UNCG posted a 21-8 overall record.

Doug Hamilton - Men's Soccer



(Inducted 2011) Four-year letter winner (1961-83, 1985) at UNGS and was a key member of three NCAA Division Bloational championship squads (1962-83, 1985) ... A co-captain in 1965, Hamilton was a fitst-team all-South Region and all-Divic Conference selection in 1985. UNCG was 78-11-2 (368) during his four seasons.

Jason Parsons - Baseball



(Inducted 2012) Four-year letterwinner for the Spattan baseball program as a righthandedpitcher, helping UNC6 posts a 148-78 record during his cafeer ... Spattans' all-time leader in wins (34) and saves (19), while placing second in appearances (118), third in innings pitched (324.2) and footh in career EIA (3.31)... Owns a 34-8 career record.

Dominic Pattie - Basehall



(Inducted 2012) Four-year letterwinner for the Spattans, playing second base and helping UNCG past a 148-78 record ... Holds the career records for hits (299), tuns (218), at-buts (867) and stolen bases (115), while ranking third all-time in total bases (400) ... Third Team All-America honorex in 1997 when he helped the Spattans post a program-record 45 victories.

Jack Poland - Women's Soccer Goach



(Inducted 2012) Spent 13 seasons at the helm of the Spottare, guiding UNCS from its inaugural season in 1988 through the transition to NCAA Division I ... Led his teams to a 163-92-8 record (.620) during his cafeer and seven regular season titles in the Big South and Southern Conferences (1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998 & 2000).

David Whiteside - Men's Baskethall



(Inducted 2012) Two-year letter winner for the Spattars as a post player, helping UMOS to a 33-20 overall lectrid and a 22-6 mark in the Disie Intercollegiste Athletic Conference ... Averaged 16.4 points per game and 5.2 Tebounds per contest in 51 ourings while connecting on 64.0 percent (319-nf-560) from the field and 86.2 percent (200-nf-232) from the freethflow line in his career.

Melody Gope - Softhall Head Goach



(Inducted 2013) Melody Cape was the Spartans' softball head coach for six seasaus from 1992-1997 and led UNCG to a 220-129-3 Fecord (.629) during her tenule ... She is the all-time leader in wirs in UNCG softball history and helped the Spartans to four conference tournament championships along with four appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

Alejandro Moreno - Men's Soccer



(Inducted 2013) Mejandro Moteno was a fruit-year letterwinner and statter for the mea's soccet program from 1996-2001 helping the Spartans record a 57-27-3 record (.672) during his cateer ... He was a fourtime Rist Team All-Region selection and a fruit-time All-Conference regionst.
